Term 2 Early Stage 1 Science Grid

Biological Science

One lesson should be completed from the grid to complete each week.

In the next few weeks, Kindergarten will be learning about the needs of living things. By completing the following activities students will make observations of living and non-living things. They will determine what living things can do and what they need to survive. Students identify and compare the needs of plants, animals and humans as living things.

Lesson 4 – Human Needs vs. Human Wants


Similar to animals and plants, humans also have needs that help them to survive. However, we also have wants these are things that we would like to have but that we don't necessarily need to keep us alive.
